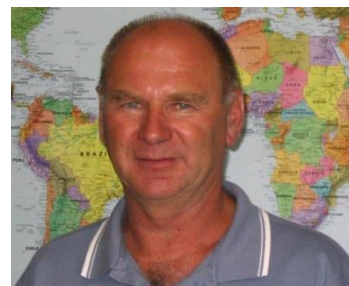


New Council Member Biographies

Harold Fast

Harold began a career in agriculture teaching animal husbandry in Tanzania in the late 1960s. He then joined a veterinary practice in southeast Manitoba. He then spent a few years doing research at the University of Saskatchewan before returning to production agriculture. Harold is the founder of a pig genetics company called Fast Genetics. He was named to Saskatchewan's Agricultural Hall of Fame in 2015.



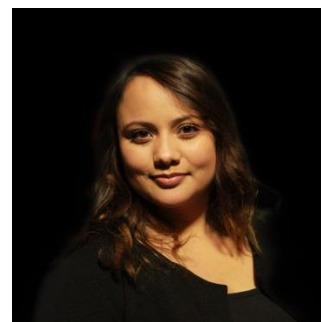
Harold now retired, lives mostly on the farm with a grass strip CHM2, which serves his own and local community runway needs. This strip supports several community fundraising events for various charities, including Hope Air. It's no different than what happens in small communities throughout Canada, where residents support a laundry list of community needs ranging from recreation complexes to senior care.

In 2018, he circumnavigated Central and South America with a group of other pilots. That was the first Give Hope Wings fundraising effort for Hope Air and raised \$520,000 for Canadian medical flights.

Candace is co-founder of the workshop community Prairie Aviators, is a strong advocate for female inclusion in aviation and a member of The Ninety-Nines.





Candace is currently the ambassador for Elevate Aviation's Saskatchewan wing, which strives to offer aviation career support, working alongside industry professionals to promote diversity and inclusion in the workplace.

Candace promotes aviation by organizing cross countries with youth groups. She also coordinates with rural communities to attend women in aviation events and presents at schools. She serves as a mentor with various organizations, including the Northern Lights Aero Foundation.
